My dear Colleague:

I am glad to acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 31, in which you ask me for some data on gravity in Mexico.

In reply I take pleasure in sending you under separate cover the paper presented in 1948 at the Oslo Meeting by Ing. Alfonso de la O Carreño.

In my opinion this paper contains part of the data that you are asking me. The copy I am sending has been specially signed by the author as a compliment to you, attending my suggestion.

Unfortunately I cannot send you now Mr. Alvarez' paper, because I have not at hand available copies, but I will do so, as soon as Mr. Alvarez come back from Holland where he went to attend the sessions of the International Petroleum Congress.

Professor Woollard of the Wisconsin University have sent me the data relating to measurements from coast to coast through - the continent between Acapulco and Tuxpan made in 1948 by N. C. Harding.

At present we are preparing a map which will contain the data of this work, and I promise to send you a copy of it as soon as completed.

On other hand, Mr. Woollard tell me that students of the Wisconsin University will make this year gravity determinations between Alaska and Mexico, using pendulum and gravimeter, with several purposes. When these works be finished, I will have pleasure to send you the data concerning the Mexican portion.

If you need some other details on this subject, please let me know it, as I am willing to help you according my possibilities.
